Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to venice turpentine. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is venice turpentine found?

Venice turpentine is used in painting because it adds body while maintaining gloss and brilliance. It is also found in other media, as it acts as a thickener.

How can you avoid contact with venice turpentine?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:
