Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to neroli oil. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is neroli oil found?

Neroli oil is found in aromatherapy and massage products.

How can you avoid contact with neroli oil?

Avoid products that list the following in the ingredients:

- Citrus aurantium flower oil
- FEMA No. 2771
- Neroli bigarade oil
- Neroli bigarade oil (Citrus aurantium L.)
- Neroli bigarade oil, Tunisian
- Neroli oil
- Neroli oil, pomade
- Oils, neroli
- Orange blossom oil
- Orange flower concrete
- Orange flower oil
- Orange flower oil, bitter
