

# MC267: Vanadium pentoxide

### **Patient Information**

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to vanadium pentoxide. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

## Where is vanadium pentoxide found?

In patch testing vanadium pentoxide is used to test for vanadium. Vanadium is a soft gray metal. It is used in applications for bicycle frames, cranks, axles, and gears. It is also found in glass coatings and jewelry.

## How can you avoid contact with vanadium pentoxide?

Avoid products that list the following in the ingredients:

- EINECS 231-171-1
- HSDB 1022
- Vanadium
