Patient Information

Your patch test results indicate that you have a contact allergy to oak moss absolute. This contact allergy may cause your skin to react when it is exposed to this substance although it may take several days for the symptoms to appear. Typical symptoms include redness, swelling, itching, and fluid-filled blisters.

Where is oak moss absolute found?

Oak moss absolute is found in soaps, lotions, massage oils, diffusers, potpourri, air fresheners, body fragrance, perfume oils, aromatherapy products, bath oils, towel scenting, incense, light rings, laundry detergents, facial steams, and hair treatments.

How can you avoid contact with oak moss absolute?

Avoid products that list any of the following names in the ingredients:
